Dear Parents



Once again we have reached the end of another successful year and the School would like to thank each and every parent, guardian, friend and stakeholder who has contributed to this great success. This success of this school is also attributed to the involvement of the community as a whole who remain dedicated to the aims and goals of the school and assist where they can.

The Management would like to remind you of the voluntary Parent Contribution Fund (PCF), which has been introduced to cover additional costs not provided for by the Ministry of Education. The

contribution towards this fund is voluntary and we would like to thank all parents / donors who have contributed so generously towards this fund throughout the year.

This money is utilized on behalf of your child for the value added education component in OSS. We would like to emphasise that a parent pay the full amount and cannot just join the service for a couple of months. These learners receive all additional notes, support teaching and they pay less for school extra-mural activities, sport and transport. The limited funds received from the Ministry of Education, Arts and Culture only cover the basic needs like tests, examinations and basic homework assignments. Through the value added component, OSS undertakes to equip your child to receive the best possible education, in line with the private schools of Namibia, where parents pay many thousands of dollars per month.

Furthermore, we would also like to remind the parents that every learner has to contribute one ream of Copy Paper (A4 - 500 sheets, $80g/m^2$) at the beginning of each trimester. The school has received no allocation for stationary and cleaning materials for 2020, which means that there is more pressure on parents to supply the basic needs.

Some learners have also not handed in all their textbooks for 2019. These books will have to be refunded or replaced before school starts in 2020. Unfortunately, the school / MOEAC cannot replace these books meaning that some learners will be without textbooks in the new year. Learners must keep the receipt of payment for lost books with them for control purposes when reporting back to school in January 2020.

As far as the School Uniform is concerned, we can support you with the Clothes Shop, which will be open on 13 and 14 January 2020. We would like to ask you to ensure that every learner is in possession of the proper school uniform before the school starts. Please ensure that your child's hair should also be compliant with school rules, i.e. not dyed, but plated and cut according to the Code of Conduct of Otjiwarongo Secondary School.

Further, on the school still experiences problems with learners who bring cell phones to the school. We would like to remind you that no learner may have a cell phone in his/her possession during school hours. Please ensure that your child leaves his/her cell phone at home.

Unfortunately, many learners make themselves guilty of being absent from school without permission. This is seen in a very serious light, as the school will not be able to fulfil its mandate of providing quality Education.

Management also would like to request that learners not be signed out from school for trivial reasons as this has a direct effect on the education they receive.

Please, familiarize yourself with the contents of the Code of Conduct. Otjiwarongo Secondary School's success is built on discipline and the adherence to the norms and values set out in this document.



Clothes Store




The Clothes Shop will be open during the first week of school and we would like to ask you to ensure that every learner is in possession of the proper school uniform before the school starts.

Summer School Uniform Code

NO alternatives will be allowed

-Navy Blue Trousers (*Boundary*) – <u>Grade 12</u> only **GIRLS**

- White short-sleeve shirt
- Blue (Navy) skirt (must be +-5cm above the knee)
- White school socks (no grey socks allowed)
- Black School shoes
- Hair according to the code of conduct (no alternatives allowed)
 BOYS
- White short-sleeve shirt (no long-sleeve shirts allowed)
- Short Grey School Pants
- Long Grey School Socks (*no short grey socks* allowed)
- Black laced SCHOOL shoes (no fashion shoes allowed)
- Plain Black belt if needed (no fashion belts allowed)

ACCESSORIES

Learners may only wear a **normal watch**. **No smart watches or smart devices allowed**.

Girls MAY NOT wear fashion ear accessories or bracelets. Only small studs or rings (Gold or Silver). Nothing else.

SCHOOL RULES AND CODE OF CONDUCT – PLEASE TAKE NOTE

All learners have signed the Code of Conduct and rules. Parents must support the school in this regard. Effective education starts at home. Make sure your child behaves, is dressed and adheres to the school rules.

Some rules recapped:

- WO learner may colour his/her hair. Learners who have coloured their hair should have their hair professionally returned to their natural colour BEFORE the school starts 2020.
- We will take strict action against learners who come to school with coloured hair.
- Parents should also please see that their child's hair is cut according to the rules as per OSS Code of Conduct.
- Boys are <u>not allowed</u> to have a "step" (when hair on top of the head is considerably longer than the hair closer to the neckline).
- Boys and girls are <u>not allowed</u> to have bizarre hairstyles upon returning to school.

We kindly request parents to adhere to the rules as stipulated in the Code of Conduct and to see that their child is dressed according to the summer-wear quidelines.

Support and E-Learning

O.S.S is the **only** school that provides E-Learning facilities to learners. Learners can register at the office of the Secretary for E-learning for as little as **N\$50.00** per month.

Learners then use the Internet, Advance Mathematics Programs and Online Subject support with tests to enhance their understanding of subject content. All the content subjects such as Mathematics, Life *Science, Physical Science, Biology, Geography* and more are available. Learners can attend E-Learning classes Mondays to Wednesdays from 14:00-16:30. Register your child and let them be the change you want to see. Registration can be done at the school secretary.

Points of interest.

- Parent Support Fund payable at the Secretary's Office.
- Registration for support learning at secretary's office.
- Absenteeism Parents must notify the school if a learner is absent. Parents will be notified via sms of unauthorized absenteeism
- Procedure in regard to absenteeism must be followed. Parents must remember they are primarily responsible to ensure that children are in school every day.
- Parents must sign learners out if they leave school during school hours. The school will sms parents if learners are absent without prior notification or without a Doctor's Certificate. This is a serious transgression and will be dealt with accordingly.
- Learners may only leave the school grounds with the written consent of parents.

- Parents will receive regular sms's with regard to absenteeism,
 SDF and learner behaviour. This method ensures that parents know immediately if there is a concern regarding to your child's welfare.
- **Cell phone policy** and procedures state: **NO cell phones** at the school during official school hours.
- **Summer uniform** (as prescribed in the School Rules) for the second term are available at the Clothes Store on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 07:30 07:50.
- REMEMBER: ONE (1) REAM OF COPY PAPER PER TERM PER LEARNER.


